The Little Mermaid, 30 years on



In celebration of the 30 year anniversary of the release of **Disney's The Little Mermaid** in 1989, Alan Menken's uplifting, Academy Award winning score is brought to life by the West Australian Symphony Orchestra in three magical performances.

Rebellious 16-year-old mermaid Ariel (Jodi Benson) is fascinated with life on land. On one of her visits to the surface, which are forbidden by her controlling father, King Triton, she falls for a human prince. Determined to be with her new love, Ariel makes a dangerous deal with the sea witch Ursula (Pat Carroll) to become human for three days. But when plans go awry for the star-crossed lovers, the king must make the ultimate sacrifice for his daughter.

The seven songs featured in *The Little Mermaid* were written and honed over a period of eighteen months. During that time, the songwriters set up in a "music room" at the animation studio facility in California, where lyricist Howard Ashman spent at least two weeks out of every month.

Sing-along to all your favourite songs including *Under the Sea*, *Part of Your World* and *Kiss the Girl* as you re-live this classic 'tail' of Ariel.

The music for *The Little Mermaid* won two Golden Globes®, two Grammys®, and two Academy Awards®. Menken and Ashman picked up an Oscar® for "Under the Sea," and Menken won an Oscar® for his infectious score to the film.

About the Composer

Alan Menken Composer

Alan Menken's music and lyrics have become an integral part of film and popular culture over the course of nearly four decades. His song and score credits for film musicals include Little Shop of Horrors, The Little Mermaid, the animated and live action versions of Beauty and the Beast, Newsies, Aladdin, Pocahontas, The Hunchback of Notre Dame, Hercules, Home on the Range, Enchanted and Tangled. He has also composed extensively for stage musicals, television, and additional films including Rocky V, Home Alone 2: Lost in New York, and Marvel's Captain America: The First Avenger.

Menken has won more Academy Awards than any other living individual, with eight Oscars® (four for Best Score and four for Best Song). Winner of the 2012 Tony and Drama Desk awards for his score for the



stage musical *Newsies*, he has also won 11 Grammy® Awards (including Song of the Year for "A Whole New World"), seven Golden Globes, London's Evening Standard Award, the Olivier Award, the Outer Critics Circle Award and the Drama Desk Award.

In 2010 he received a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.

About the Lyricist

Howard Ashman Lyricist

Howard Ashman first came to prominence when, as founder and artistic director of New York's WPA Theater, he conceived, wrote and directed a musical adaptation of Kurt Vonnegut's God Bless You Mr. Rosewater, with music by Alan Menken.

In 1982 he conceived, wrote and directed Little Shop of Horrors, again with music by Menken. The musical was immediately successful, leading to a hit motion picture and Broadway and West End revivals. In 1986, Ashman wrote and directed the Broadway musical, Smile, which featured music by Marvin Hamlisch. Turning his talents toward film, Ashman was pivotal in the renaissance of Disney animated musicals and in the development of Disney's The Little Mermaid (Producer and Lyrics), Beauty and the Beast



(Executive Producer and Lyrics) and *Aladdin* (Lyrics), all with music by Alan Menken.

Ashman's numerous awards include two Oscars®, two Golden Globes, four Grammys®, a Drama Desk and a London Evening Standard.

About The Conductor

Nicholas Buc Conductor

Nicholas Buc is a composer, conductor and arranger. He studied Composition at the University of Melbourne, where he received the inaugural Fellowship of Australian Composers Award. As the recipient of the Brian May Scholarship, he completed a master's degree in Scoring for Film and Multimedia at New York University, receiving the Elmer Bernstein Award for Film Scoring. In 2007 he was nominated for "Best Original Song Composed for the Screen" in the APRA-AGSC Screen Music Awards, and in 2015 won the NYU Film Scoring Competition.

Nicholas has conducted the world premieres of *Beauty and the Beast*, *Harry Potter and the Half-Blood Prince*



and John Williams' Close Encounters of the Third Kind. Other live film concerts include Pixar In Concert, E.T., Back to the Future, Casino Royale, Jurassic Park, Psycho, as well as both Star Wars and Harry Potter concert series.
