Troy Miller

Troy Miller is a multi-instrumentalist, composer, conductor and producer; a rare talent whose artistry transcends the confines of genre.

Troy's unique skillset and collaborations have led to many exciting orchestral projects across diverse artists and genres. Troy has worked with orchestras including the London Philharmonic Orchestra, Netherlands Philharmonic orchestra, The Philharmonia, BBC Concert Orchestra and returned to conduct the London Symphony Orchestra in 2017 in a concert of his own arrangements of Laura Mvula's studio albums for Symphony Orchestra to a sold-out Barbican.

2019 brings the exciting collaboration with Stewart Copeland and the Lights Up the Orchestra tour, which Troy will conduct and has helped co-arrange and orchestrate.



As a prolific and talented producer and Ivor Novello award-winning writer Troy has produced albums including Laura Mvula's The Dreaming Room, Grammy Award-winning Gregory Porter's More Liquid Spirit, Rebecca Ferguson's Superwoman & Lady Sings The Blues and worked on John Newman's record Tribute which has sold over 1.3 million copies in the UK.

About The Artists

Laura Mvula

British-born Laura Mvula's debut album. Sing to the Moon, was released in 2013 to critical acclaim. After winning multiple MOBO awards and receiving nominations for Ivor Novello and Brit Awards, 2016 saw Myula receive her second Mercury Prize nomination in three years for The Dreaming Room. Recorded over a 12-month period, this record was an expansion of what was an already captivating sound, and duly went on to win the 2017 Ivor Novello Award for Best Album. If Sing to The Moon was the sound of a young artist honing her craft, then The Dreaming Room can be described as the sound of a confident and accomplished lyricist showing the progression of an artist who has truly come into her own. Since the release of this record, Laura has gone



on to compose the music for the RSC's production of *Anthony and Cleopatra* which opened in Stratford in March 2017 and later transferred to the Barbican. In 2018 she collaborated with author Ben Okri, writing a musical accompaniment to his poem *Love Like A Lion*, a composition that was debuted at the Proms.

José James

Minneapolis born vocalist, José James has consistently delivered eclectic and alluring melodies to the public for over ten years. James blends elements of jazz, R&B and hip-hop to create the distinctive sounds that make his work unique. The Los Angeles Times boasts, "James [is a] genre hybridist who claims both b-boys and jazz purists in his fan base... a winningly singular presence in contemporary American music. Not just singular, but magnetic."

Throughout his career, James has released seven albums, all of which have earned him accolades worldwide from critics and music lovers alike. James has played on prestigious stages all over the world, including the Central Park Summerstage in New York, The Kennedy Center in DC, London's Royal Festival Hall and Billboard Live Tokyo, to name a few.



James' latest musical venture, Lean On Me: José James Celebrates Bill Withers pays homage to one of his personal heroes, Bill Withers. Released on Blue Note in September 2018, with this album James aims to unite listeners and champion each other's voices and stories through Wither's brilliant catalogue.
